## COSMETOLOGY / INSTRUCTOR TRAINING Certificate

### About the Program

The Cosmetology program at Calhoun provides a curriculum which includes theory, skills, and salon ethics required to become a licensed cosmetologist. Students practice techniques in a supervised salon setting including hairstyling, nail care, chemical services, and skin care. Computer instructional materials also are utilized for tutorial and testing reviews. Classes are available on a full-time, part-time, or evening basis. Certification typically requires five semesters of full-time attendance.

### Career Opportunities in the Field

Cosmetology is a growing and challenging field in which professionals may choose from one of several careers such as **Licensed Cosmetologist, Nail Technician, Instructor, Salon Manager/Owner, Platform Artist, Manufacturer's Representative, and State Board Examiner.**

Cosmetologists and barbers hold about 750,000 jobs, with one-half of all cosmetologists being self-employed. Part-time jobs attract many people who want to combine a job with family, school or other responsibilities.

Cosmetologists earned income (full-time employment) is currently between \$20,000 and \$30,000. Those who receive training to perform a wide range of services and who show an ability to attract and hold regular customers will improve chances of finding employment in full-service salons.

### How Do I Apply?

Applicants must meet the admission requirements of Calhoun Community College. Applicants should be eligible to take English 101 and Math 100, Math 112 or Math 116 or have permission of the instructor. ### How Much Will it Cost?

Tuition at Calhoun — the fees paid to take classes— is among the lowest in the area. A full-time student will pay between \$1140-\$1520 per 15-week semester. Since the college does not have dormitories, the only other costs will be for transportation to and from class and books and supplies.
